Euston Farm Update from Matthew Hawthorne (Farm Manager) - Hello all and welcome to another Euston Farms update. In the last month we completed the Sugarbeet and the Maize drilling. As I write this report we are loving the continued spell of rain after such a dry spring. Now we are getting the warmer night temperatures along with the rain the farm has exploded with growth. Not just crops but also hedges and trees. Polythene has now been removed from January planted carrot and fleece from early potatoes. These two products are used on the crops the warm up the soil and encourage plants to grow at the earliest part of the spring. School visits are now happening more with visits to outdoor pigs today and looking at adaptation on the farm and in nature 2 weeks ago. The children never cease to amaze me in all the years we have been taking them onto the farm to learn about our fabulous part of the country we live in, the questions and understanding along with impeccable behaviour makes it so rewarding.
